Week 44 of 52 *Hebrew Words Every Christian Should Know* by Dave Adamson: "*Ravach (raw-vakh')*" = *spacious place*. In the 20th century, Germany's leaders infamously used the concept of "lebensraum" or "living space" to justify their perceived need to expand. The Hebrew word includes not just land, but also the ideas of breathing and being refreshed. Consider these uses of the word in the Old Testament:

"He brought me out into a spacious place" (<u>II Samuel 22:20</u>, also <u>Psalm 18:19</u>; <u>118:5</u>).

"You have set my feet in a spacious place" (Psalm 31:8).


