Week 49 of 52 Hebrew Words Every Christian Should Know by Dave Adamson: "Ger (gare)" = refugee. This word shows up often in the Old Testament where it is also translated as "stranger" or "foreigner" or "immigrant." Over thirty times in the Old Testament, the Lord's people are told to love the "ger." Sometimes these commands are included with the exhortation to look after the poor, the widows and the orphans. So love for the stranger is consistent with the principle that God's people are called to show compassion for the most vulnerable among us. (Continued on facing page)
