<u>Sermon Notes:</u> "What Our Deeds Deserve" by Curt Deming, Teaching Pastor, <u>Luke 23:26-43</u>
Old Testament Reading, <u>Psalm 22:1-19</u>; New Testament Reading, <u>Acts 7:54-60</u>.

This **Part III** in **Luke 19:28-20:19** will cover these three topics:

- A. Ministry in Jerusalem (Luke 19:28-21:28)
- B. Passion (Luke 22:1-23:56); In recent weeks we have covered:

"In Remembrance of Me": God's providential will is going to occur with or without our help, but it's better for us to remain in his moral will; Jesus used the Last Supper to teach about salvation under the New Covenant; n the Kingdom of God, leaders serve and sacrifice.(<u>Luke 22:1-30</u>)

"When You Have Turned Back": The cross of Jesus accomplishes our redemption by satisfying the wrath of God; Failure has painful consequences, but it does not disqualify us from service in the Kingdom of Heaven. (Luke 22:31-46)

"When Darkness Reigns": Beware of making bold predictions about your own future behavior; Jesus is not surprised by our failure; In the Kingdom of Heaven, even our past failures can be useful. (Luke 22:47-62)

"Are You the King?": Who is Jesus? — A question for all. Jesus and His followers submit to governmental authorities. We support the government with taxes, prayers, and obedience.; Yet, the Bible give us no reason to expect the government to help us with our mission. (<u>Luke</u> 22:63-23:7)

"Their Shouts Prevailed": Truth is greater than majority opinion; Jesus is King of the upside-down kingdom. Rather than killing to save himself, he died to save us.; Barabbas is like us. Jesus took the penalty he deserved. (<u>Luke 23:8-25</u>)

C. Resurrection and Ascension (<u>Luke 24:1-53</u>) — In weeks to come

#### What we will learn this week:

- Jesus could have saved himself, but he offered himself for us.
- Our salvation <=> an exchange of righteousness = "Double Imputation"
  - ⇒ The penalty for our sins was paid at the cross.
  - ⇒ The righteousness of Jesus is imputed to believers.

If Jesus was enduring this punishment who was not guilty, how much more will be the punishment for Jerusalem who are guilty? (Luke 23:26-31)

The prophecy of Isaiah is here clearly fulfilled. (Isaiah 53:12) Why do you think that all four gospels are very succinct in their description of the crucifixion? (Luke 23:32-33)

David wrote 1000 years prior with a far more descriptive prophecy. How many can you count from <a href="Psalms 22:16-18">Psalms 22:16-18</a>? (<a href="Luke 23:34">Luke 23:34</a>; See also <a href="Psalms 22:16-18">Peter 2:21-24</a>)

The taunt "save yourself" was is repeated three times by three different groups of people. Why do you think Luke makes a point of this? (<u>Luke 23:35-43</u>)

What could Jesus have done, but chose not too? (Matthew 26:53-54); see also the <a href="https://www.hymn.by.nc.">hymn.by</a> <a href="https://www.nc.">Ray Overholt on Youtube</a>.)
