

<u>Sermon Notes:</u> "He Has Risen" by Curt Deming, Teaching Pastor, <u>Luke 24:1-10</u> Old Testament Reading, <u>Psalm 16:1-11</u>; New Testament Reading, <u>Acts 2:22-36</u>.

This **Part III** in **Luke 19:28-20:19** will cover these three topics:

A. Ministry in Jerusalem (Luke 19:28-21:28)

B. Passion (Luke 22:1-23:56) — Last Week

"A Righteous Man" (Luke 23:26-43) (1) Jesus is humanity's only righteous man, and therefore, he is our perfect sacrifice. Theological term called "Substitutionary Atonement." (2) Although it is not easy to believe in the resurrection, alternate theories of what might have happened are even more implausible.

C. Resurrection and Ascension (Luke 24:1-53) — BEGINNING TODAY

What we will learn this week:

- On Sunday after the crucifixion, Jesus rose from the dead.
- Because he accurately predicted His own death and resurrection, we should believe His
 other words.

Why did Jesus come into the world? (John 18:37)

Orthodoxy == Right belief Orthopraxy == Right conduct/behavior/practice

Accounts of the resurrection was it:

(1) Legend? (2) Mass hallucination? (3) Truth

Jesus received myrrh as one of he gifts from the 'wise men'. What were the women's expectation as the went to the tomb where Jesus was lain? What embalming spice had they brought with them? (Luke 24:1)

Luke shows restraint in giving the women's account. What was the condition of the grave site and what did they see there? (<u>Luke 24:2-4</u>)

What appeared as angels made what declaration to the women that we now use as a greeting in faith? (Luke 24:5-6)

If one going to create a legend in that day, would Luke take such a matter of fact description and have women as the witnesses? (Luke 24:1-6)

Apologetics == Defense of the faith

The angels he told you so. Let's read those statements made by Jesus earlier in Luke. (Luke 9:21-22; Luke 9:43-45; Luke 18:31-33; Luke 18:34)

Luke identifies women that gave this witness, those very well known by the disciples and others. To whom did they give their report? (<u>Luke 24:9-10</u>)

Luke again is restrained and factual as he recounts the witness of he resurrection. Did the men simply take the women at their word? (Luke 24:11)

What did Peter, the one who denied him thrice, do and see? (Luke 24:12)

Here are some of the witnesses and what they saw:

(a) women and others \leftrightarrow *Crucifixion*; (b) Roman soldiers (Centurion) \leftrightarrow *Jesus' death* (c) Joseph of Arimathea and women \leftrightarrow *Tomb where Jesus was wrapped and lain*; (d) women \leftrightarrow *Empty tomb on Sunday*; (e) women \leftrightarrow *Two angels' proclamation*; (f) angels \leftrightarrow "He has risen!"; (g) Peter (soon after John) \leftrightarrow *Empty tomb*; (h) Peter \leftrightarrow *Linen strips and head covering*.
