Old Testament Readings: [Deuteronomy 4:25-31](#); New Testament Reading: [John 6:35-40](#).

April 18 —“The Call of Jeremiah”, [Jeremiah 1:1-19](#).

- The call of God is more than an invitation.
- The Lord equips those he calls.

April 25 —“Promiscuous Worship”, [Jeremiah 2:1-37](#).

- Everybody worships.
- There is only one true God who is worthy of our worship.
- Therefore, any alternative plan is doomed.

May 2 — “A Tale of Two Sisters”, [Jeremiah 3:1-4:4](#).

- The Lord restores the broken.
- ... But only the broken.

May 9 —“Terror on Every Side”, [Jeremiah 4:5-6:30](#).

- We are all “rejected silver.”
- But the Lord offers “rest for your souls.”
- Also, don’t be stubborn.

May 16 —“Truth has Perished: Jeremiah’s Temple Sermon”, [Jeremiah 7:1-8:3](#).

- Rejection of God leads to separation from God.
- Religiosity is no substitute for loyalty and obedience.
- Also, don’t be stubborn.

May 30 —“No Balm in Gilead”, [Jeremiah 8:4-10:25](#).

- False gods are nothing at all.
- Stubbornness is a barrier to truth.
- The Lord delights in kindness justice and righteousness.

June 6 —“Four Kinds of Destroyers”, [Jeremiah 11-20](#)

- We have a responsibility to believe what is true.
- Only the word of the Lord is trustworthy.
- The end is not the end.

June 13 —“A Righteous Branch”, [Jeremiah 21-25](#)

- The Bible is rooted in history and geography.
- One day a righteous king will come to lead us.
 - ◊ Until then, expect sowing and reaping.
 - ◊ Also, be sure you are on the right team.
- We should consider prophecy through a lens of Scripture.

What will we learn this week?

- Rather than “ God + country,” it’s “God > country.”
- Rebellion against God lead to forfeited blessings.
- It is not too late to turn to God.

The prophet Jeremiah confronted kings, the people, and other “prophets.” These other prophets gave so called “messages from God” that included these four lies:

- 1) The temple shows God’s approval of Jerusalem.
- 2) Babylon will not conquer Judah.
- 3) Babylon’s power will end soon.
- 4) The exile will end quickly.

Which was considered as blasphemous: to Judah: an unpatriotic prophecy or disloyalty to God ([Jeremiah 28](#))?

The Lord made covenantal pronouncements that have everlasting truth:

- Someone (Jesus) will sit on the throne of David forever. ([I Chronicles 17:14](#))
- The temple of God persist into eternity. ([I Kings 9:3](#); [Psalm 23:6](#))

However, the law given to Israel (Judah) had conditions that must be met (if you ... [obey], then ... [blessings]. But if you ... [disobey], then ... [curses])). (ref: Moses blessing and curse). ([Deuteronomy 28](#); [Deuteronomy 15:20-30](#))

Which of these promises, after great patience and mercy, was the Lord invoking?
