

 - ♦ Nebuchadnezzzar's reign began 4/23/587 BC
 - ♦ The 10th year of Zedekiah's reign ended 10/17/587 BC
 - ♦ Siege began 1/15/588 BC
 - \diamond 586 BC siege ends with the destruction of Jerusalem by the Babylonians.
