<u>Sermon Notes:</u> "The Last Days of Judah", by Curt Deming, Teaching Pastor, <u>Jeremiah 34-45</u>. Old Testament Reading: <u>II Samuel 7:8-16</u>; New Testament Reading: <u>John 3:1-16</u>.

Jeremiah, so far:

- The call of Jeremiah (Chapter 1)
- Message of doom (2-10)
- Reason for judgement (<u>11-20</u>)
- Jeremiah's confrontations (21-29)
- The Book of Comfort (30-33)

What we learned last week: (Jeremiah 30-33)

- Our salvation is based upon the Lord's righteousness, not ours.
- We will be His people, and He will be our God.
- The Lord will restore Israel and Judah.

What will we learn?

- History == His story.
- Shopping for alternate truth is a trap.
- The Lord intervenes on behalf of His people.

Overview of Jeremiah 34-45

- God's faithfulness and Judah's infidelity (34-35)
- Judah's rejection of God's word (36)
- Judah's last days (<u>37-39</u>)
- Judah's rebellion against Babylon (40-41)
- Judah's rebellion against God (42-45)

Jeremiah prophesies that Zedekiah will go to Babylon. However, Ezekiel had prophesied that the king will not see Babylon, but he will die there. How can both of these prophesies be true? (Jeremiah 34:1-5; Ezekiel 12:10-13)

Zedekiah went his own way, so called 'freedom', but the Lord commands us to 'hear and obey' Him. What is the Hebrew word for this concept? (<u>Jeremiah 34:17</u>; <u>Bible Study Tools Hebrew Lexicon</u>)

Compare and contrast these two case studies:

- Zedekiah and Judah (<u>Jeremiah 34:8-22</u>)

What did the Lord ask Jeremiah to do for which we are now most grateful? (Jeremiah 36:1-2)

What was Baruch subsequently to do? (Jeremiah 36:4-8)

What was King Zedekiah's response? (Jeremiah 35:23-25)

What happened to Baruch and Jeremiah as an immediate consequence? (Jeremiah 36:26)

What was the king's response to the word the Lord gave to Jeremiah? (Jeremiah 36:27-31)

The words of Jeremiah, as that of a true prophet, came to pass historically with respect to Jerusalem (<u>Jeremiah 39:1-2</u>) and to Zedekiah, king of Judah (<u>Jeremiah 39:4-7</u>).

How was Jeremiah treated by the Babylonians, and what choice did Jeremiah make? (Jeremiah 39:11-12; Jeremiah 40:4; Jeremiah 41:1-2)

In the aftermath Jeremiah seeks the Lord for some of the remnant as they desire to flee to Egypt. What happens to Egypt (and to them)? (<u>Jeremiah 44:29-30</u>)

How much did Baruch and Jeremiah enjoy the hardships of the tasks they were required of the Lord to do? (Jeremiah 45:1-2)

What did the Lord do for them? (Jeremiah 45:5)
