Sermon Notes: "The Man and the Book", by Curt Deming, Teaching Pastor, **Jeremiah 52**.

Old Testament Reading: Ezra 1:1-7; New Testament Reading: Ephesians 2:1-10.

Jeremiah, so far:

- The call of Jeremiah (Chapter 1)
- Message of doom (2-10)
- Reason for judgment (11-20)
- Jeremiah's confrontations (21-29)
- The Book of Comfort (30-33)

What we learned three weeks ago: (Jeremiah 30-33)

- Our salvation is based upon the Lord's righteousness, not ours.
- We will be His people, and He will be our God.
- The Lord will restore Israel and Judah.

What we learned two weeks ago: (Jeremiah 34-45)

- History == His story.
- Shopping for alternate truth is a trap.
- The Lord intervenes on behalf of His people.

What we learned last week: Jeremiah 46-51

- Our Lord is King over all the earth.
- The Lord always opposes idolatry and violent oppression.
- Vindication and vengeance are prerogatives of God.

What will we learn?

- Jeremiah's interior life with God empowered his ministry, as it will for all of us.
- God's providential hand guides history and our salvation.
- We are all exiles, living in a land that is not our true home.

What sustained Jeremiah in many times of loneliness and opposition? (<u>Jeremiah 1:4-5</u>; <u>Jeremiah 15:16</u>)

We as Christians are in this world, in this nation, but what is the hope of our ultimate location? (Jeremiah 29:10-11; Jeremiah 29:12-14; Jeremiah 31:31-33)

Outline of Jeremiah 52:

- Fall of Jerusalem / blinding of Zedekiah (Jeremiah 52:1-11)
- Destruction of the temple (Jeremiah 52:11-23)
- Davidic lineage (<u>Jeremiah 52:31-34</u>)

What happened to the temple, royal palace, all the (large) houses, and every important building?

There were two major Babylonian civilizations:

- Old Babylonians = Amorites, like Hammurabi (1792–1750 BC).
 - ♦ Roughly contemporary with Moses.
- Neo-Babylonians = Chaldeans, like Nebuchadnezzar (604-562 BC).

What happened to all the sacred objects that Solomon had commissioned and installed in the temple in Jerusalem? (Jeremiah 52:17-24)

What happened to all the priestly and civil leaders of Judah when they were taken from Jerusalem? (Jeremiah 52:24-27)

What eventually happened to the Jehoiachin who was king of Judah for a very short time before being exiled to Babylon? How might this have impacted the exiles and remaining remnant of Judah in Babylon? (Jeremiah 52:31)
