## What learned last week: (Job 1-2)

- Sin causes suffering, but not all suffering is caused by sin.
- For God's people, suffering can be purposeful.
- Sometimes there is more going on than we can see.

#### Wisdom Literature

- Job
- Ecclesiastes
- Proverbs
- Some Psalms
- Probably Song of Songs (Solomon)

#### Tools for wisdom literature:

- Read it all (or at least in context).
- Learn which terms were different, e.g., fool.
- Follow the logic of the dialogue.

### Big questions:

- Why do the righteous suffer?
- Who is wise?
- Can God be trusted?

#### Outline of Job:

- Prologue (1-2) last week
- Job's lament (<u>3</u>) this week
- Job's friends (4-25)
- Job's reply (<u>26-31</u>)
- Elihu (32-37)
- The Lord (38-42:6)
- Epilogue (42:7-17)

Soliloquy — The act of speaking one's thoughts aloud when by oneself, or regardless of any hearers, especially by a character in a play.

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#### Job's curse to reverse creation:

"Let there be light

• "May it turn to darkness"

• "God saw the light was good"

"May God above not care about it"

### Common elements of laments:

- Addressed to God, usually with a plea for rescue
- Confession of sin or protestation of innocence
- Hope in, or praise of, God at the end.

• Job 3:8

Psalm 74:14

• Job 41 (named in verse 1, but entire • Psalm 104:24-26 chapter describes him)

• Isaiah 27:1

- Why did I not perish at birth?
- Why were there knees to receive me?
- Why was I not stillborn?
- Why is light given to those in miserv?
- Why is life given to a man whom God has hedged in?

## Jesus' Why:

My God, My God, why have you forsaken me? (Matthew 27:46; Mark 15:34)


#### What have we learned?
