Sermon Notes: "The Friends of Job", by Curt Deming, Teaching Pastor, <u>Job 4-27</u>. New Testament Reading: <u>Mark 2:1-5</u>. Old Testament Reading: <u>Psalm 1:1-6</u>.

What learned two weeks ago: (Job 1-2)

- Sin causes suffering, but not all suffering is caused by sin.
- For God's people, suffering can be purposeful.
- Sometimes there is more going on than we can see.

What have we learned last week: (Job 3:1-26)

- We should be quick to listen and slow to speak.
- We should bring concerns to God, not complain about Him.
- Jesus is The Righteous One who suffered on our behalf.

Big questions:

- Why do the righteous suffer?
- Who is wise?
- Can God be trusted?

What we will learn?

- With increased intimacy comes greater power to give comfort or inflict pain. (Job 16:2-3)
- Truthful words are not always useful words.
- When our Redeemer returns, he will bring vindication. (<u>Job 19:25-</u>
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Job's friends:

- Eliphaz the Temanite
- Bildad the Shuhite
- Zophar the Naamathite (Over)

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Eliphaz:	Job is getting what he deserves.	(<u>Job 4-5</u>)
Job:	Wrong, and also, I'm not receiving comfort.	(<u>Job 6-7</u>)
Bildad:	Job should repent.	(<u>Job 8</u>)
Job:	Will plead with God.	(Job 9-10)
Zophar:	Repent!	(Job 11)
Job:	Defends himself and prays to God.	(Job 12-14)

Round 2:

Eliphaz:	Accuses Job of folly.	(<u>Job 15</u>)
Job:	Rebukes his friends and prays for relief.	(Job 16-17)
Bildad:	The wicked are punished.	(<u>Job 18</u>)
Job:	Anticipates his Redeemer.	(<u>Job 19</u>)
Zophar:	Discourse on the fate of the wicked.	(<u>Job 20</u>)
Job:	The wicked go unpunished.	(Job 21)

Round 3:

Eliphaz:	This is why you suffer.	(<u>Job 22</u>)
Job:	Not guilty and frustrated with God's apathy.	(Job 23-24)
Bildad:	How can we be righteous?	(Job 25)
Job:	Summary and review.	(Job 26-27)
