

Sermon Notes: "Jesus: From Preparation to Public Ministry," by Rick Krebs, <u>Matthew 4</u>. Old Testament Reading: <u>Deuteronomy 6:10-19</u>. New Testament Reading: <u>John 1:43-49</u>.

What will we learn?

- · Jesus' transitions from baptism to testing.
- The temptations: What were they for?
- Jesus' first public ministry as a preacher/teacher.
- Jesus begins to build His team.

Jesus was led by whom to go to the desert? (Matthew 4:1)

Does the scripture indicate Jesus knew what would happen there? (Matthew 4:1; Genesis 7:4; Exodus 24:18; Exodus 34:28; and contrary to 1 Kings 19)

What was Jesus doing there that is a model for us? (Matthew 4:2)

Knowing Jesus bodily condition, what would the devil be getting Jesus to do by changing the stones into bread? (Matthew 4:3; Matthew 20:28)

The devil takes Jesus to the pinnacle of the temple and tells he to jump off. Why do you think Jesus did not do this, even though the devil quotes what seems to be an appropriate scripture for seemingly just such a situation? (Matthew 4:5-7)

The devil then takes Jesus to the top of a very high mountain. So, there are two times that the devil has transported Jesus to a different place. How would the devil be able to do this? (Matthew 4:5 and Matthew 4:8)

What do you think is the basis upon which the devil believes he can offer Jesus all the kingdoms of the world and their glory? (Matthew 4:8-9; Ephesians 2:2; Ephesians 6:12)

Given that the devil (supposedly) had all of this to offer, can you think of two reasons why Jesus turned down the offer? (Matthew 4:10; 2 Corinthians 5:15)

Who came to Jesus after the devil left? (<u>Matthew 4:11</u>) What do you think it means that they "attended Him"?

What appears to be the event that signaled Jesus' ministry to begin in Galilee and Capernaum? (Matthew 4:12-14)

Jesus had the same core message as John. What was it? (Matthew 3:2; Matthew 4:17)

What prophecy did Jesus fulfill in going there? (Matthew 4: 15-16; Isaiah 9:1-2)

Jesus selects the first two pairs of disciples along the Sea of Galilee. Who were they? What relationship did they have to each other? What vocation did they all share? (Matthew 4:18-22)

What kind of people and miracle did Jesus perform along the Sea of Galilee? (Matthew 4:23-25)
