Because Jesus immediately begins talking about who is your master. Therefore, is this your physical eye or is it from who do you get your perspective on life? ([Matthew 6:24](#))

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Therefore, if your “eyes” are not right, how does this relate to our propensity to worry? ([Matthew 6:25](#))

Is God aware of the every day needs of birds, flowers, grass? ([Matthew 6:26-31](#))

What position with God do we enjoy with respect to the birds, flowers, and grass? ([Matthew 6:26b](#))

Does God know that we need food and clothing? ([Matthew 6:32](#))

Therefore, should we worry about tomorrow? ([Matthew 6:34](#))
