

Sermon Notes: "Who wants to be a disciple?" <u>Matthew 8:18-34</u>, by Rick Krebs . Old Testament Reading: <u>Daniel 7:13-14</u>. New Testament Reading: <u>Mark 5:1-5</u>.

What we learned last week: (Matthew 8:1-17)

- The leper One of unthinkable touch
- The centurion One of word
- Peter's mother-in-law One of familiarity
- The multitudes Jesus' mission continues.

What will we learn? (Matthew 8:18-34)

- The one ready to serve <u>now</u>.
- The one ready to serve <u>later</u>.
- The disciples themselves still have much to learn.
- The knowledge of the demons.

When Jesus saw the crowd, he gave orders to cross over to the other side of the lake (Sea of Galilee)? Some reasons He ordered this suggested by others, might be that:

- The crowd was locally growing so large and drawing undue attention to Him. This undue notoriety pre-maturely would force His ultimate timing and goal in Jerusalem.
- The gospel needed to be brought to the Gentiles (pig herders) across the lake.
- He knew that ahead was demonstrations of His authority over the tempest and the demonic kingdom.

What do you think? (Matthew 8:18)

The first disciple, a teacher, came to Jesus to demonstrate his loyalty. Yet Jesus lets hm know what the discipleship would cost. What decision did this disciple make? What about you? (Matthew 8:19-20)

Jesus often refers to Himself as the "Son of Man." Do you think the 'teacher-disciple' might have understood who He was and how crucial his discipleship would be? (See "son of man" throughout the mission of <u>Ezekiel</u>; <u>Daniel 7:13</u>; also see <u>Psalm 80</u>, especially <u>verse 17</u>)

The other disciple wanted to respect his father by burying him (a long process). Jesus' mission was primary and urgent. Did Jesus saying, "... and let the dead bury their own dead" imply that those left behind vice those that choose to follow Him would find themselves among the living, perhaps forever? (<u>Matthew 8:21-22</u>)

The seasoned fishermen and sailors amongst the disciples were terrified by the ferocity and chaotic nature of the storm (possibly satanically instigated: Job 1:12, 18-19). What was Jesus state mind and authority over the natural (and supernatural) world? (Matthew 8:23-27)

Did the demons know who Jesus was? Did the demons know their ultimate fate? Did Jesus have dominion over them? (<u>Matthew 8:29</u>; <u>Matthew 8:32</u>)

Why would the demons request to be sent into an animal rather than elsewhere? (<u>Matthew</u> 8:30-31; <u>Matthew 12:43-48</u>)

A dictionary meaning for Gadarene is 'involving or engaged in a headlong or potentially disastrous rush to do something' (<u>Oxford</u>). Note that this is what the demon-possessed swine did. Might this be the paths taken by the lives of the Greek people in Gadarenes? Might this be how the two men became possessed by the demons. (<u>Matthew 8:32-34</u>)
