

What we will learn this week: (Matthew 12:1-19)

- John the Baptist's ponder from prison
- Jesus' tribute to John the Baptist
- The contrast: Jesus and John the Baptist
- Applying our learnings for today.

When we last were in Matthew, chapter 10, Jesus had instructed the twelve disciples to go out two by two. Why would Jesus send them out alone while he went on to preach and teach? (Matthew 10; Matthew 11:1)

John the Baptist had been now been imprisoned by Herod for some time. John baptized Jesus and heard the Father and saw the Holy Spirit descend on him. Why now do you think he sent his disciples to ask Jesus if he was the Messiah or whether their was another to come? (<u>Matthew 11:2</u>)

Why do you think John sent two disciples? (Deuteronomy 19:15b)

Jesus instructed John's disciples to report what they saw. Given the evidence of what they saw and the way Jesus spoke to them, why would that would be a decisive declaration to John? (Matthew 11:4-6; Isaiah 35:5-6; Isaiah 61:1-3)
