

How likely is it that one who has fallen away (maybe was never truly repentant) to be brought back to repentance? (**Hebrews 6:5-6**)

What serious act has a person in effect done who has "fallen away?"

<u>Hebrews 6:7-8</u> uses an agricultural metaphor to describe the life of one that has truly fallen away from the faith. Can you relate this metaphor to one Jesus used? (<u>John 15:1-17</u>)

There are five views as to whom the author is referring in these passages:

- 1. Falling away of sincere believers
- 2. Hypothetical situation—"if it were possible" (John 10:27-29)
- 3. Falling away of insecure believers
- 4. Discipline upon lethargic believers
- 5. Specific apostacy: Relapse to Judaism.
