### • Gospel = Good News

- ♦ The Good News is what we receive (not invent), stand upon, and are saved so long as we continue to hold onto it with all our hearts. (Romans 1:16a)
- ♦ The message is a historical claim—these things happened in real time and space.
- ♦ The resurrection was not a private event, nor was it a spiritual event. Jesus Christ bodily returned to life—a new life—and appeared to eye witnesses: the twelve apostles and 500 people at one time.
- Christ's resurrection is essential to the gospel.
  - Christ died for our sins.
  - ♦ Christ's message that through him we can have peace with God.
  - ♦ Without the hope of the resurrection our Christian faith is useless and empty of any power.
